- Connection to the Internet from your computer (response times for the application may vary depending on your internet connection speed).
- Adobe Acrobat Reader V8.0 and above
- Valid GS1 Recall Health Username and Password

### **GS1** Recall Healthcare Terms and Definitions

Term	Definition
ACCC	The Australian Competition and Consumer Commission is an independent Commonwealth statutory authority whose role is to enforce the <i>Competition and Consumer Act 2010</i> and a range of additional legislation, promoting competition, fair trading and regulating national infrastructure. There is a legal requirement that the ACCC must be notified of all safety related product Recalls.
Approver	The person who provides approval of a recall notification prior to its submission.
Company Type – Initiator	An Initiator company is responsible for providing accurate, clear, and timely information regarding a recalled or withdrawn product to a Receiver company for appropriate action. Initiators can be manufacturers, importers, wholesalers, distributors and even retailers. They are typically the organisation responsible for the product being recalled or withdrawn.
Company Type - Receiver	A Receiver company is typically a retailer/wholesaler/distributor or manufacturer that needs to receive a notification from their suppliers. Receivers are responsible for acting on the information from the Initiator Company in a timely manner.
Company Type - Both	This company type applies to organisations that need to be able to create and issue recall and withdrawal notifications as well received them. This company type also can 'on forward' a notification. For example, a State Health Authority may receive a notification from a Healthcare Supplier and will forward the notification to other entities under their jurisdiction, i.e. pathology services. Similarly, a Hospital may receive a recall or withdrawal notification from a supplier and they will on forward to other units within the hospital. Finally, a retailer of therapeutic goods that receives a notification from a Healthcare supplier may use GS1 Recall to forward the notice to their stores.
Customer	The party that receives, buys, or consumes an item or service.
Distributor	A company or organisation that receives a notification and on forwards on the notification
Initiator	The person who initiates a recall notification, also referred to as the sponsor of the recall.



Term	Definition
Kit	A collection of different regulated healthcare items assembled for use in a single therapy.
Logistic measures	Measures indicating the outside dimensions, total weight, or volume inclusive of packing material of a logistic unit. Also known as gross measures.
Logistic unit	An item of any composition established for transport and/or storage that needs to be managed through the supply chain. It is identified with an SSCC.
Non-GTIN Packs	A packaging level for trade items where there is no trading partner requirement for GTIN identification. If a GTIN is required, then this item becomes a retail consumer trade item or standard trade item grouping.
Primary Packaging Healthcare item	The first level of packaging in direct contact with the product and marked with an AIDC data carrier either on the packaging or on a label affixed to the packaging. May consist of a single item or group of items for a single therapy such as a Kit. For packaging configurations that include a retail consumer trade item, primary packaging is a packaging level below the retail consumer trade item.
Recipient	Person who receives a recall notification.
Regulated Healthcare Retail Consumer Trade Item	A regulated healthcare trade item to be sold to the end consumer at a regulated healthcare retail Point-of Sale (Pharmacy). They are identified with a GTIN-13, GTIN-12 or GTIN-8 utilizing linear or 2D matrix bar codes that can be scanned by image-based scanners.
Regulated Healthcare Non-Retail Consumer Trade Item	A consumer trade item not intended for scanning at POS and identified with a GTIN-14, GTIN-13, GTIN-12 or GTIN-8 utilizing linear or 2D matrix bar codes that can be scanned by image-based scanners.
Regulated Healthcare Trade Item	Pharmaceuticals or medical devices that are sold or dispensed in a controlled environment (e.g. retail pharmacy, hospital pharmacy).
Secondary Packaging Healthcare item	A level of packaging marked with an AIDC carrier that may contain one or more primary packages or a group of primary packages containing a single item.
Sponsor	The entity that is legally responsible to effect a recall in Australia
Health Jurisdictions	Federal, State and Territory Governments have been the major providers of public health services in Australia and each jurisdiction is responsible for creating its own constitutional priorities for public health programs, individual priorities and divisions of labour. GS1 has been engaged with all the State and Health Jurisdictions in the

Supplier	The party that produces, provides, or furnishes an item or service.
TGA	The Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA) is part of the Australian Government Department of Health and Ageing, and is responsible for regulating therapeutic goods including medicines, medical devices, blood and blood products.
Uniform Recall Procedure for Therapeutic Goods (URPTG)	The Uniform Recall Procedure for Therapeutic Goods (URPTG) is the result of an agreement between the therapeutic goods industry and Commonwealth and State/Territory health authorities. Its purpose is to define the action to be taken by health authorities and sponsors when therapeutic goods for use in humans, for reasons relating to their quality, safety or efficacy, are to be removed from supply or use, or subject to corrective action.
User Roles – Subscription Administrator	The role of the Subscription Administrator is very important in Recall as this is the person in charge for creating or suspending users in the system for your company, subscribing to services, and maintaining your company details in Recall.
	The Subscription Administrator is also the primary point of contact by GS1 Australia in relation to the service provision and would be the user that receives system and other program notifications.
User Roles – Initiator	The individual or group within the trading partner's organisation responsible for providing accurate, clear, and timely information regarding a recalled product to a Recall Recipient for proper action.
User Roles – Approver	The individual or group within the trading partner's organisation responsible for approving and issuing the completed product recall notification form in a timely manner.
User Roles – Receiver	The individual or group within the trading partner's organisation receiving and acting on the recall information from the Recall Initiator in a timely manner.
