

### **Dashboard**

When you log in, you will land on the Dashboard. This is where you can view a summary of your locations.





### **Adding a Location**


When you have clicked on the "+ Add Location" button, you will see a series of options:

- "New Location" refers to a parent/main location.
- "New Sub-Location" refers to a location that is 'under' a parent location, such as the accounts department. Note that this will require a separate GLN.(See Appendix)
- "Bulk Upload" will direct you to an Excel template where you can input multiple locations, and then upload it to the NLR. (A separate guide is available for this).



#### **Step 1: General Details**


In adding a New Location, this will direct you to this page. (If adding a New Sub-Location, it will prompt for the parent location, and then direct you to this page)



## **Step 3: Privacy and Contact Details**


Here is where you will first choose the location visibility

Then, you would provide contact details.




#### Step 2: Address Details

Here is where you would input geographical information. The form has a built-in Google Map feature. (Non-Physical GLNs should use the primary address)



## Step 4: Operational details (Healthcare users exempt from this)

Here is where you provide the schedules of the location. You can also add in facilities that are available to drivers.

Here are some tips to note when adding a location.



## Inputting multiples of an attribute

The platform does not act like an ordinary text document; it requires you to click on the 'add' button, and although it may look as though the information has disappeared, it has been placed into a table below it.


Throughout the process of adding a location, there are opportunities to add more than one entry, such as having multiple contact persons, or different trading hours.

This 'add button' allows users to have multiples of an attribute.




#### **Step 5: Logistical Details**

Users who have a subscription to the Transport service of the NLR will see Step 4 and 5.



#### **Summary Page**

There is a final page when adding a location to check all the details. You can edit from here rather than navigating back in the browser.








## Managing your Locations

In the 'My Locations' menu item, you can select loaded locations, view them, and edit the information.

'Trusted Companies' displays the list of companies you have allowed to view your restricted locations.










## **Setting Up Auto- Alerts**

Setting up Auto-Alerts allows users to be notified by email when there are new locations or changes to existing locations on the NLR.

These alerts can be configured to suit user needs.







Here is a list of all companies subscribed to the NLR. There is a search button to assist you finding particular companies.

Note that this is adding **companies** to the autoalert, and not just specific locations.

Remember to click the 'Add to Auto Alert' button to place selected companies into the table below. You can do this progressively, instead of selecting all the companies you want in a single action.

Remember to save, and from this point in time, updates to the subscribed companies will prompt an email notification

## **Support**

This page describes the various avenues of support for the National Location Registry.

#### **Ouick Icons**

This tray of icons is always available in the top-right corner of the User Interface. From left to right:

- -Support Icon leads to the support page, where you will find a support number to call, our email, and a link to our NLR documentation, including the Bulk Upload Guide.
- -API icon stores the various documentation if your company uses an Application Programming Interface
- -Profile icon is where you can check your company and account details. It is also where you would enter in Error Tickets for support purposes.

#### Feedback Icon

This icon is always available in the bottom-right corner of the User Interface.

Hovering the mouse over this will expand out a support icon, as well as a feedback/bug report icon.

The support icon leads to the same details as mentioned above.

The Feedback Icon will pop out a form to report any technical bugs on the UI.

When viewing a location, there is additional functionality to notify the location owner of any incorrect or outdated information.

## **Appendix**

The remaining pages are tables that contain permissible Location Types for corresponding GLN types; and a list of Location Functions.

#### ATTENTION!

The allocation of multiple GLN types to a single location can create significant problems when the use of the location changes or there is a change to location ownership. GS1 Australia strongly advise to only allocate one GLN type per location and create a new location record for other GLN types.

These tables may help in Step 1 of the process in adding a location.

These are also found in the Bulk Upload Guide

#### Note:

To obtain additional GLNs, users are required to be members of GS1 to be allocated numbers for use.

If you have only subscribed to services of GS1, such as Recall and the NLR, you will need to apply for a GLN-Only Membership.

If you have barcode numbers from GS1 Australia, you can apply for Additional GLNs under 'Application forms for existing members' or purchased through the MyGS1 Customer Portal.

Location Function	Definition
Accepting Party	Party accepting goods, products, services etc.
Bill From	Party issuing an invoice.
Bill To	Party which receives the invoice and pays for the goods
Bill of Lading Recipient	Party to receive Bill of Lading.
Buyer	Party to which Goods or Services are sold
Carrier	A company, which physically transports goods from one place to another.
Consignee	The entity who will receive the physical shipment
Consignor	The entity who will ship the physical shipment.
Consolidator	Organisation consolidating various consignments, payments etc.
Customs	Identification of customs authority relevant to the transaction or shipment.
Customs Broker	Organisation responsible for the preparation of documents and/or electronic submissions, the calculation on behalf of the client of taxes, duties and excises, and facilitating communication between the importer/exporter and governmental authorities.
Delivery Party	Organisation to which goods are delivered.
Despatch Party	Organisation where goods are collected or taken over by the carrier.
Distributor	Party distributing goods, financial payments or documents.
eMessaging Receiver	Party receiving the message.
eMessaging Sender	Party sending the message

Location function	Definition
Equipment Owner	Owner of equipment (container, etc.).
Exporter	a person, country, or company that sends goods or services to another country for sale
Factor	An Organisation that purchases financial receiving instruments e.g. invoices
Freight Forwarder	A Party specialises in arranging storage and shipping of goods on behalf of shippers.
Healthcare Provider	Organisation providing healthcare to patients, consumers, individuals
Importer	A person, country, or company that brings goods or services into a country from abroad for sale
NPC Information Provider	A party providing the information contained in the document using the National Product Catalogue
NPC Information Recipient	A party which is named to be the recipient of all documents using the National Product Catalogue
Insurer	A person or company offering insurance policies for premiums.
Issuer Of invoice	Organisation which issues an invoice.
Logistics Service Provider	An umbrella term for an entity, which provides a combination of many different transport and logistics related services for another entity.



Location Function	Definition
Payee	Organisation, which receives payment.
Payor	Organisation which initiates payment.
Point of Sale	Refers to the retail type checkout where bar code symbols are normally scanned.
Purchase Order Receiver	The organisation that receives the purchase order for the goods or services.
Recall Health Recipient	Organisation/Location/Individual receiving Recall notifications via Recall Health
Recall Health Sponsor	Organisation sending Recall notifications via Recall Health
Recall Recipient	Organisation/Location/Individual receiving Recall notifications via Recall

Receiving Location	An area where trucks or rail cars are loaded (shipping) or unloaded (receiving). Used to load or unload trade items for logistics.
Remit To	Organisation to whom funds are directed for payment of a commercial invoice.
Seller	Organisation which sells products or services to a buyer.
Service Provider	An organisation providing services for another organisation (e.g. re-packing supplier's products).
Ship From	Physical location where a shipment of goods originates.

Location function	Definition
Storage and Handling	The movement, protection, storage of products throughout manufacturing, warehousing and distribution
Supplier	The party that produces, provides, or furnishes an item or service.
Transportation Carrier	The party undertaking or arranging transport of goods between named points. Can be air, road, rail or sea carrier
Warehouse Keeper	Organisation taking responsibility for goods entered into a warehouse.
Wholesaler	Seller of articles, often in large quantities, to be retailed by others.
